

Review of Kerrville-Schreiner Park, Texas

[Kerrville-Schreiner Park](#) is located along highway 173 (Bandera Road) in Kerrville, Texas, just South East of the Loop 534 intersection. The park is approximately an hour drive from San Antonio and is convenient for camping or day trips. Take I-10W to Kerrville exit 508, turn left onto hwy 16S, turn left onto Loop 534 and follow to the end, turn left and entrance is on the left. The park is actually split by the highway with a thin strip of park with some camping spots along the river and a much larger section on the other side of the highway. This larger section contains many more camping sites, cabins and hiking/biking trails.

The park's camping sites are spacious and shaded. Tent camping is allowed. RV sites have full hookups and are loop pull-throughs so that all RVs are in a line along the road. This opens up the "personal space" for each camp site. Sites include a picnic table and fire/barbeque pit. The restrooms are adequate and clean though small. There are also cabins available for rent in their own section of the park.

Kerrville-Schreiner has miles of hiking and biking trails through a heavily wooded area of the park. One trail includes a steep hill that provides a scenic view of the park and surrounding area. Fishing is available in the Guadalupe River which runs along the edge of the park. The park is home to a very large deer population that makes regular appearances at camp sites in the evening.

Reservations are available but exact sites are assigned on a first come-first served basis. With its easy drive from San Antonio, large camp sites, beautiful trails and friendly deer population this park ranks high on my family's camping list.
