

Review of Lake Medina RV Resort, Texas

Located along the Medina River on the very north end of Lake Medina is a very nice RV Resort that my family frequents. We usually stay there 2-3 times a year and rented a spot for 2 months this past summer making the short drive every weekend or commuting to work from the campsite during the week.

The resort is located on a working ranch bordering Medina Lake. It's located in Lakewood Estates off 1283 just north of the Park Road 37 intersection. To get to the camp, turn into the Lakewood Estates entrance and follow the RV signs. After you enter the ranch gate you'll drive along a winding road through their wooded pastures often filled with horses or cattle. During the evenings you will see a large herd of deer roaming around the area. The campsites are on a wooded plateau along the banks of the Medina River. Most of the time the Resort has direct access to the lake with its own boat ramps. Many of the RV sites border the water and during normal years boaters can cruise or ski right in front of their sites even beaching their boat within sight of their camp. This year of course, with water levels so low, the lake water doesn't reach up to their bend in the river. It's a short drive to the County Park or down to Red's by the dam to put your boat in now. Nevertheless, the resort is very nice with plenty of shade over most of the sites to help keep the temperature down.



Overall, the facilities at the resort are excellent. They have one main building near the entrance that doubles as the main office, tiny store, rest rooms, laundry, pool house and social center. The adjoining stone pool is very nice with a built in Jacuzzi tub that is disabled in the summer unfortunately. The pool tends to be the center of activity when water levels are low but normally guests spend much more time in the lake. Sites are all full hook-up with 30 and 50 amp service. One nice, recently added amenity is wireless internet access available throughout the park for a minimal fee. No tenting is allowed at all in the resort but they have a small number of very nice cabins available for those who don't want to "rough" it. They even have some storage available for boats and RVs and overflow storage should your boat not fit on your site. The only detractors from the whole package are some older buildings off to the left near the entrance and some rather odd looking cabins down by the boat ramps. Otherwise the Resort is very well kept and beautiful to see.

The Resort is also very popular with "Winter Texans" taking advantage of our mild winters and they have a few semi-permanent full-timer residents. The owners make a special effort to make people feel welcome. On Friday's they have a barbeque where, for a few dollars, you can get hamburgers or pork loin or brisket with all the fixings depending on what Tom's grilling. During the winter months the social events increase
